A message from the Pastor...



Welcome. Jazzy Fry-day emerged from a series of strategic planning opportunities whose focus was to continue the legacy of our congregation of believers in Christ. We are the oldest African American Baptist congregation in Los Angeles. We are also designated by Los Angeles as a cultural landmark. We are designated by the Department of the Interior as a historic site, as

well. Organized in 1885 we have maintained an uninterrupted presence in the Los Angeles community for 132 years.

In our strategic planning, we came together as a congregation to decide how we could continue to build on the legacy of this fellowship of faith. We embarked on remodeling our worship facility which was designed by Paul Williams and completed for occupancy in January 1926. We updated our facility while maintaining the guidelines of preserving the architecture and other requirements as a cultural landmark and historic site. Upon returning to our facility after 19 months of being housed in an alternative site in Inglewood, we began to plan the next steps of strategically planning the shape and scope of our church programming. Jazzy Fry-day is one of the ideas that surfaced whose purpose would be to reach out to the broader Los Angeles community for an evening of family relaxation, live jazz entertainment, and fish dinners. It would be a time of educating people about Jazz as a musical genre as well as exposing attendees to a historic site nestled just beyond Los Angeles' downtown skyline.

Welcome to this opportunity to be a part of the souvenir journal which chronicles and features one of the many activities of the Second Baptist Church of Los Angeles.

JAM is intended to stimulate and encourage people of all ages to participate in jazz - to study the music, attend concerts, listen to jazz on radio and recordings, read books about jazz, and more.

5. Hold a jazz-themed party in honor of a favorite musician, or to celebrate jazz in general

Jazz and Justice

This year, JAM celebrates the relationship between jazz and justice by looking beyond the music to the dynamic ways jazz has played a transformative role in social justice, musician's rights, and equality since its birth in America. To better tell this story, for the first time JAM will not feature a musician but instead highlight "one of the most influential non-musicians in jazz history," producer Norman Granz, and his work as an innovative producer, tireless promoter for his musicians, and uncompromising advocate for civil rights.

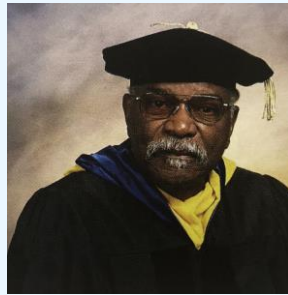

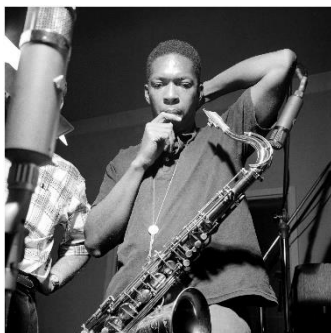

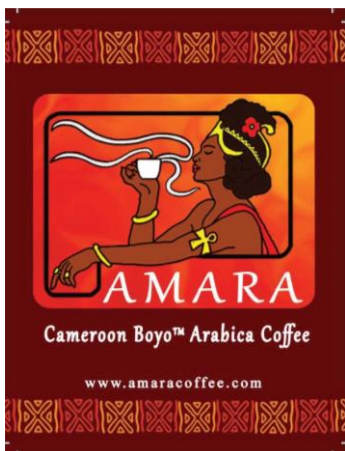
